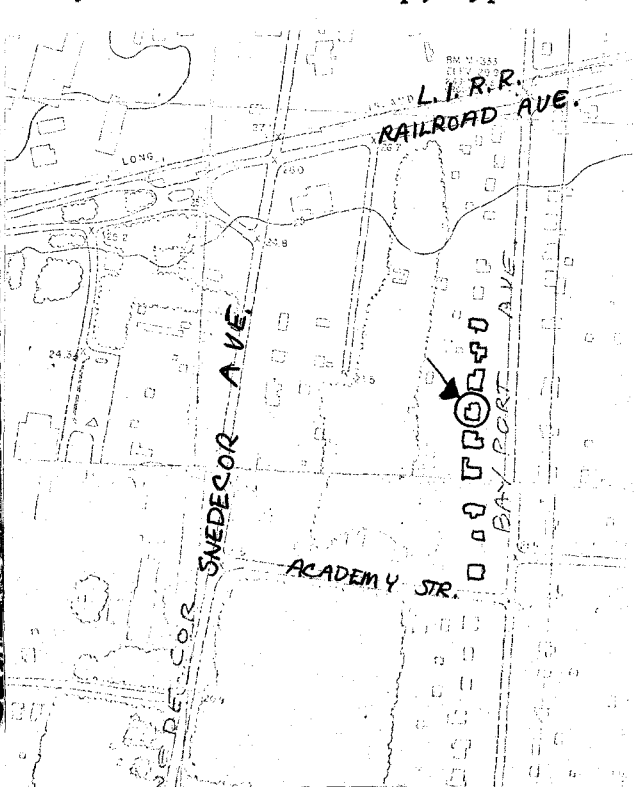

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

One and one-half story, symmetrical, Eastlake cottage, gable end to the street, with projecting gable with sawtooth decoration, above narrow vertical board and batten flanked by diamond-shaped shingles. Dentilled frieze of vertical board and batten under eaves on north and south sides. Porch with turned posts and bracketed spandrels.

This house belonged to Ed. Lynch in 1902, and to Thomas Weeks in 1915.
