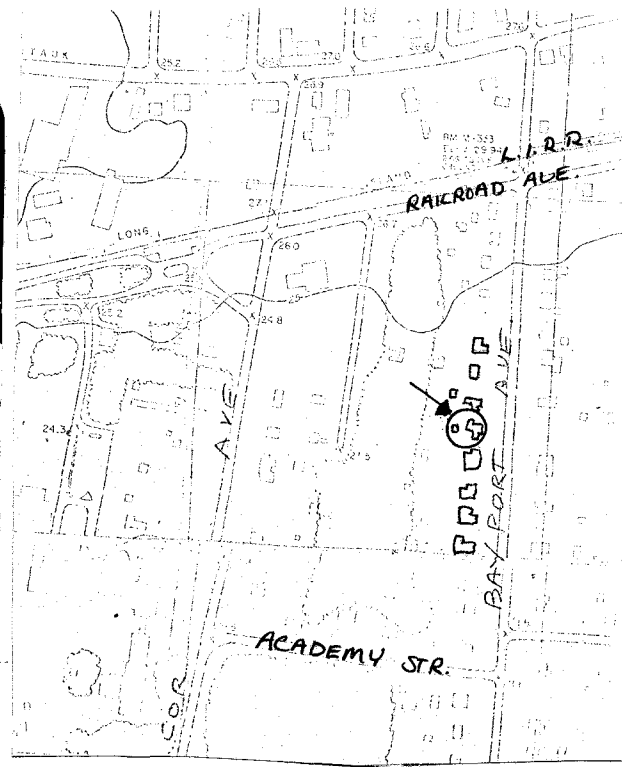

Two story, irregular, stick style, cottage with bracketed screen in gable. Arch-topped, paired windows in second floor. Oculus with stained glass over front door. Queen Anne windows multi-paned over two. Porch with turned posts and wood spandrels. Stick style most easily seen on south side.

This house belonged to Smith Weeks in 1902, and to Worth in 1915.
