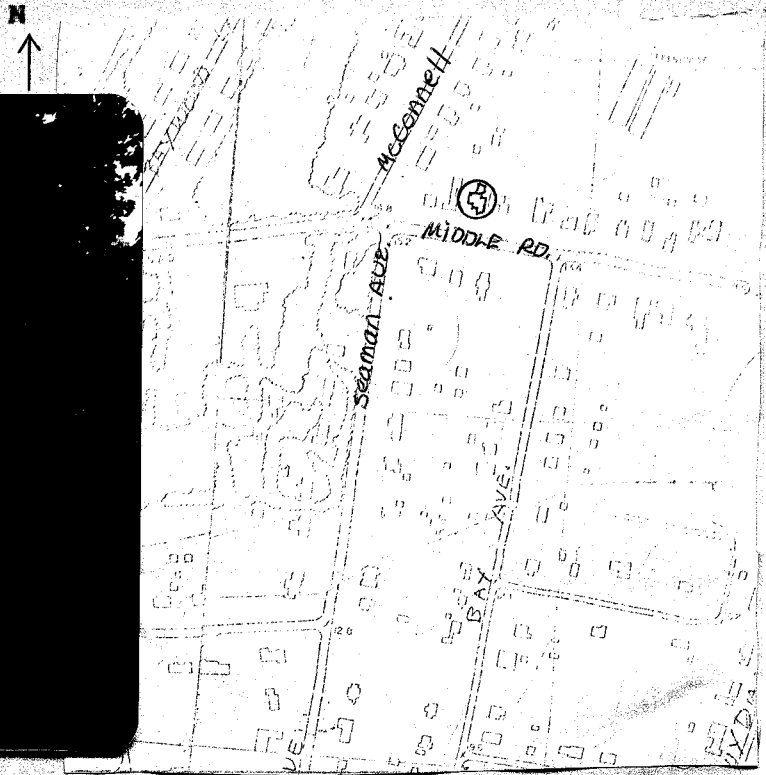
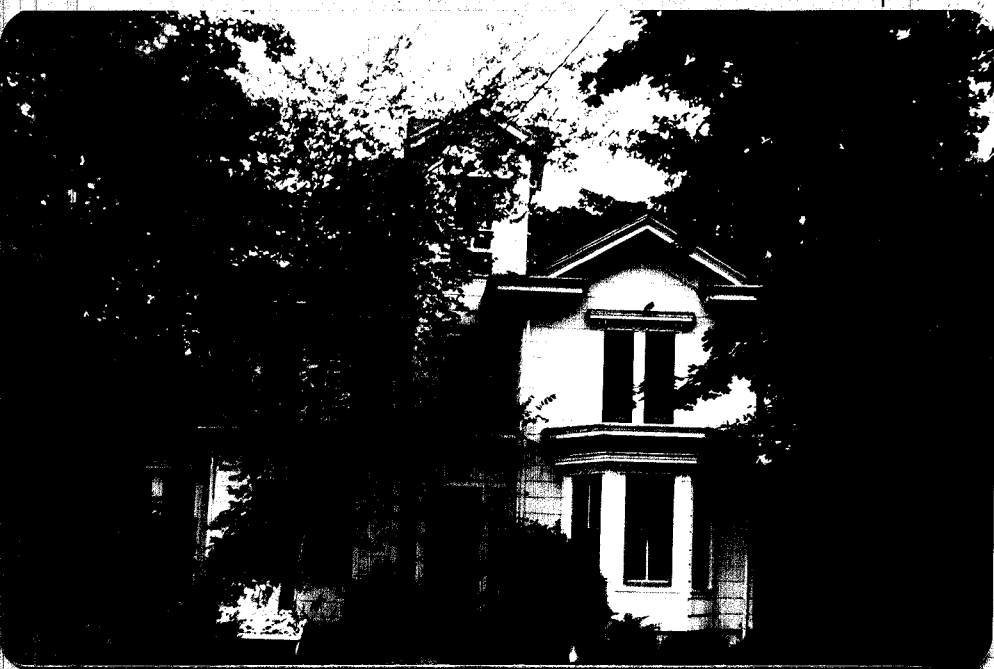

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Two story, irregular-shaped, Italianate house with three story, square, four-gabled tower on front facade. Asymmetrical, gabled roof with heavy brackets and drops. Fascia embellished with applied decorations. One story bay windows on front and west side, with double cornices matching roof cornice. Original 2/2 windows. Brick foundation. House belonged to Raynor in 1873, and to Green in 1915.
