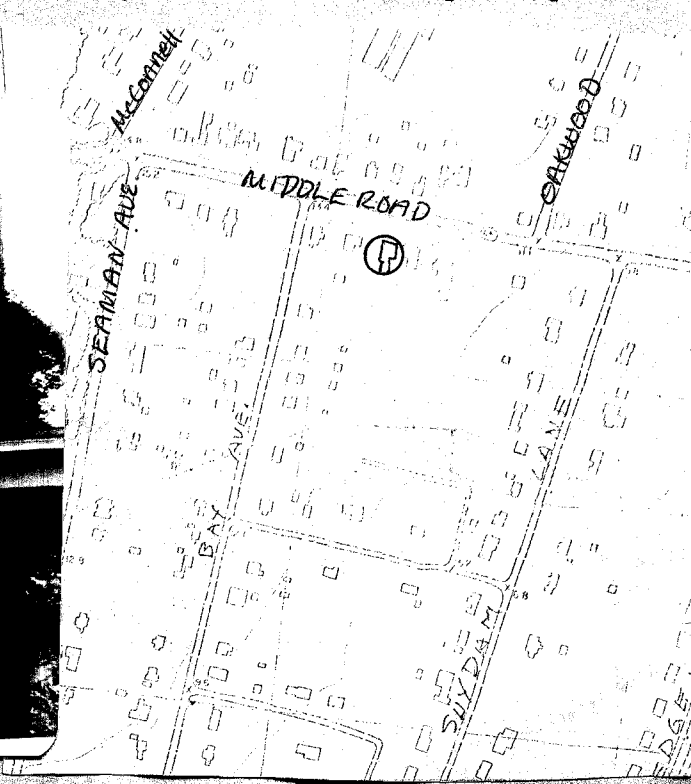
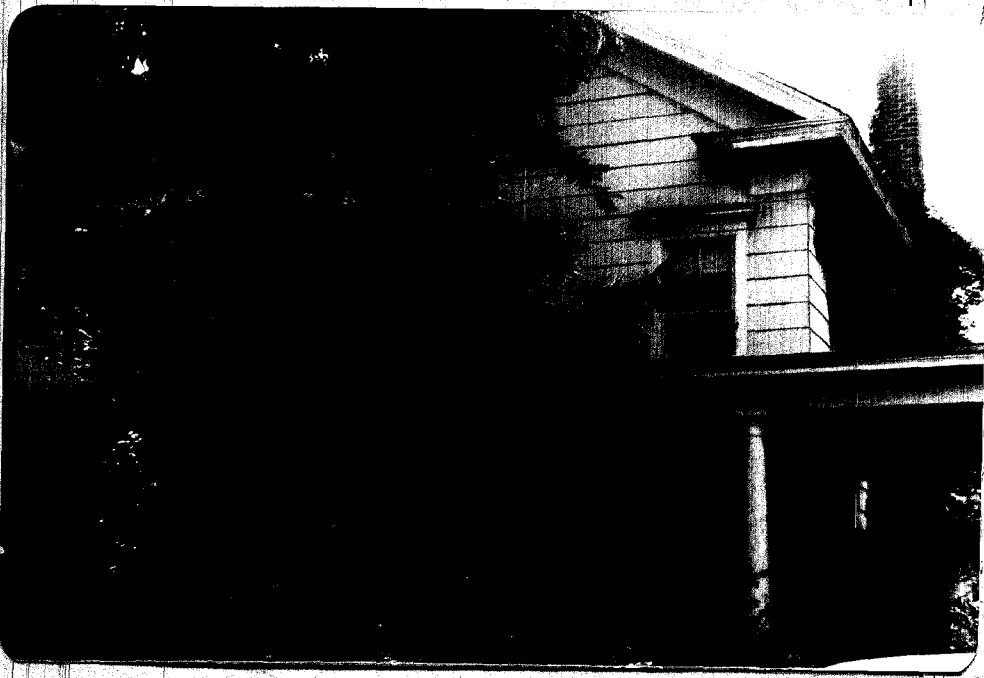

Remains of Italianate decoration on first floor window heads. Front door with transom with leaded glass. Built after 1873, with porch and porte-cochere in the style of 1900.**
