**Two and one-half story, three bays on second floor, four bays on first floor, brown shingled, gable roof house. Box cornice with returns. Dentilled entrance with pilasters. 6/6 windows. Brick foundation. Wing at rear with false front with cornice (On east side.) Probably c. 1840, it is identified as belonging to Avery on the 1858 map and to Christopher Terry in 1873. It belonged to L'Hommedieu in 1915.**
