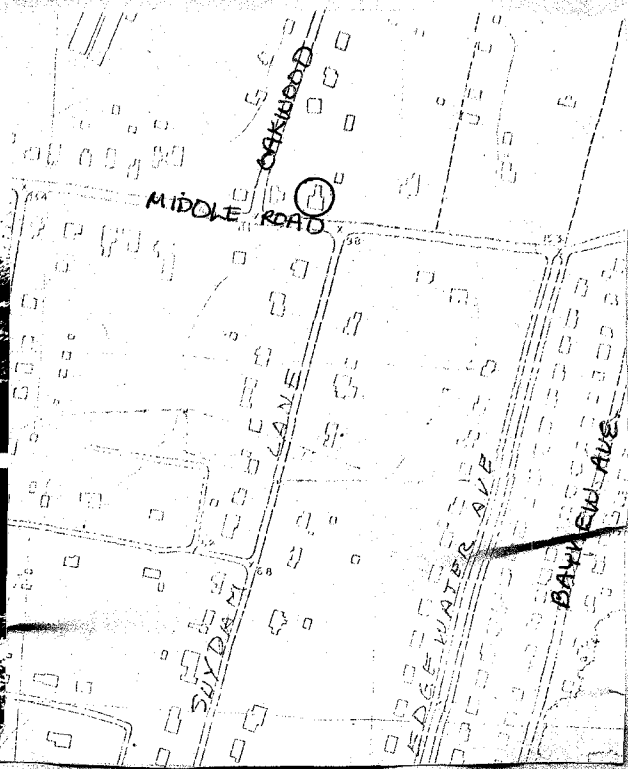

One and one-half story, single bay, gable roof house with gable end to the street, and one story, gable roof wing on east. Porch with turned posts on wing.

This house belonged to M. Hawkins in 1858, and to S. Penny in 1873. Stevenson refers to the Penny family in his book as members of St. Ann's Church in Sayville.
