One and one-half story, gambrel roof, resort/Shingle style cottage with subsumed porch with columns. Original windows with tracery in upper sash. Big gable roof dormers flanking center dormer with gambrel roof. Roof sweeps down over porch extension on east.

An M. Terry house is identified on this site in 1858. In 1873, it also belonged to M. Terry. In 1915 it belonged to A.C. Terry.
