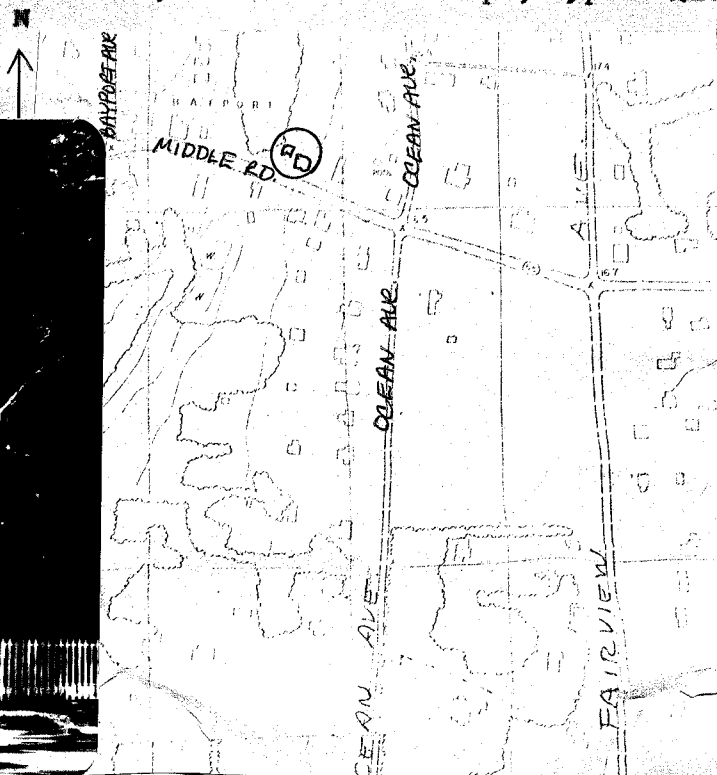

Small, one and one-half story, gable roof house with gable end to street. One story winf on west and garage, which was once an ice house, according to owner, with peaked, sweeping roof. Decorative shingles on garage peak. Picket fence. Original entranceway with transom.
 May have belonged to Howell in 1858, and to Mapes in 1873.
 It belonged to Mrs. Gardner in 1915.
