One and one-half story, two bay, gable roof Italianate house with high, wall-faced, paired and bracketed dormers. Paired brackets on roof. First floor has three bays, side entrance plan. Original porch with sawn spandrels. Gothic windows in dormers. Turned posts with applied decorations. Gable roof barn behind.

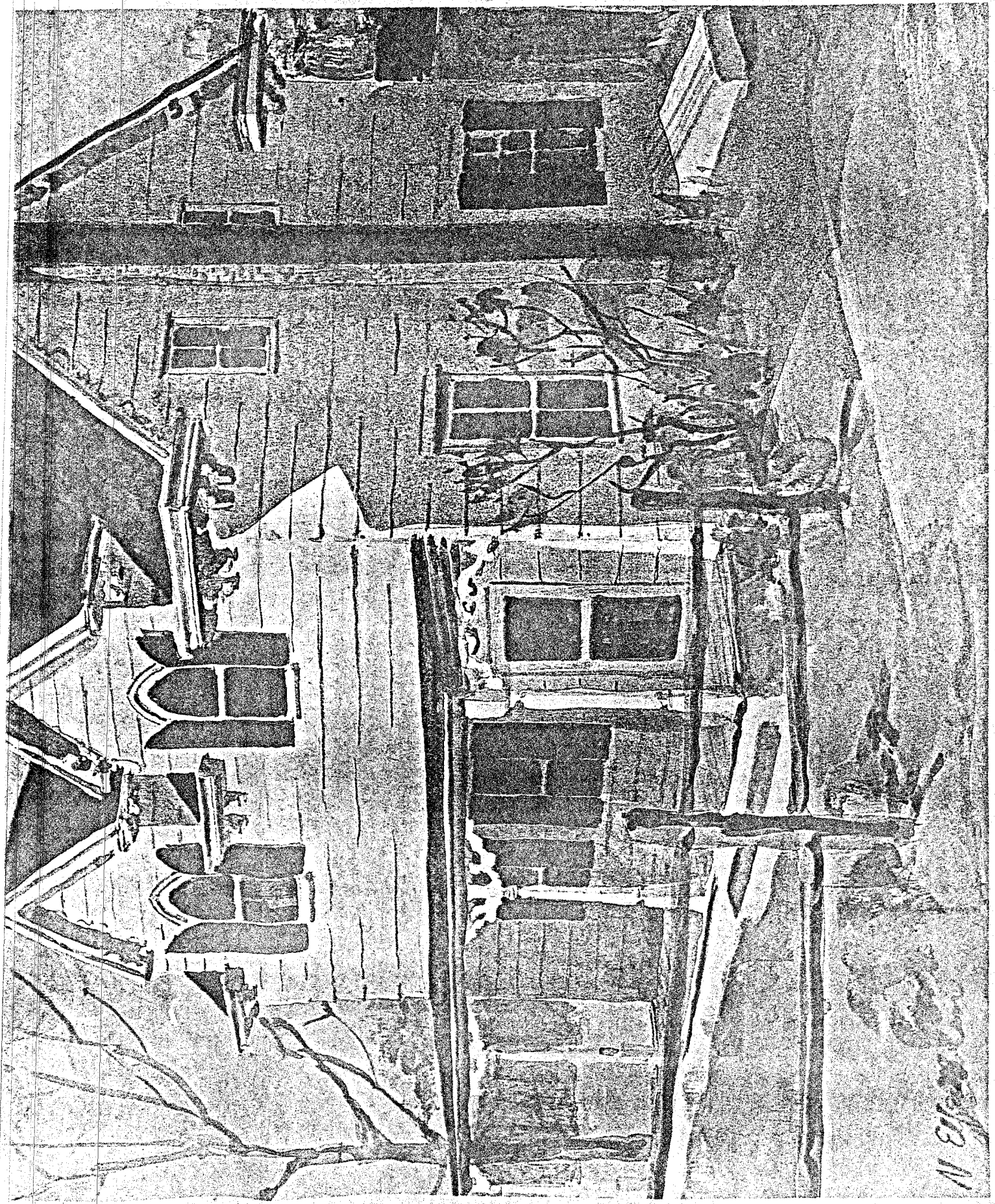
According to owner, the rear section is older, and has interlocking joints. The house belonged to Albert Pell in 1915, to W.B. Folger in 1873, and possibly to S. Weeks in 1858.
