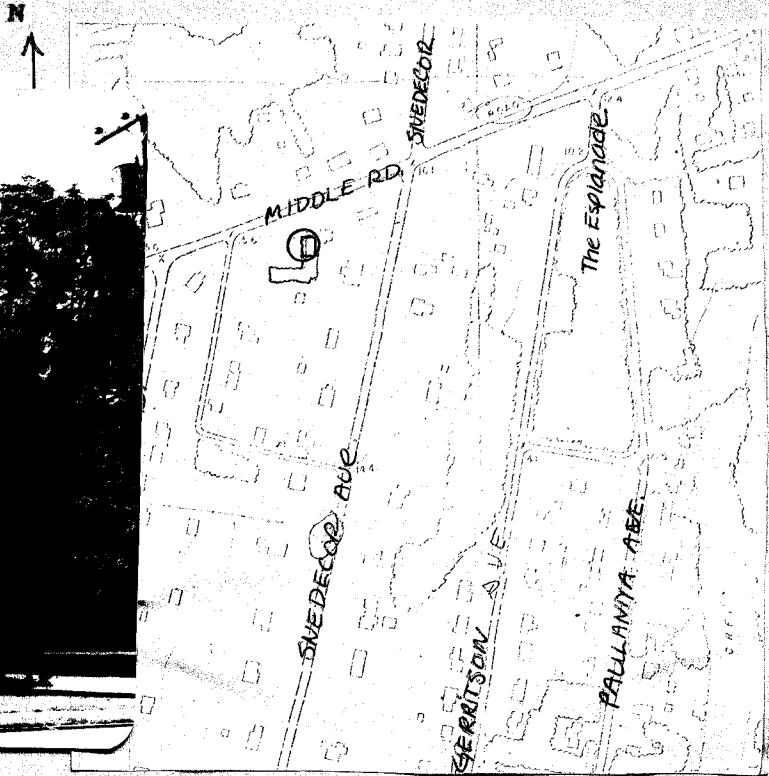

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

One and one-half story, white clapboard church with small bell tower on front. Arch-topped front entrance with stained glass spandrel. Paired arch-topped windows in tower, and Gothic opening in belfry.

According to Dickerson *, this church was completed in 1874. It was built on the site of the schoolhouse as shown in 1873. It is marked in the 1915 Atlas as M.E. Methodist Church.
