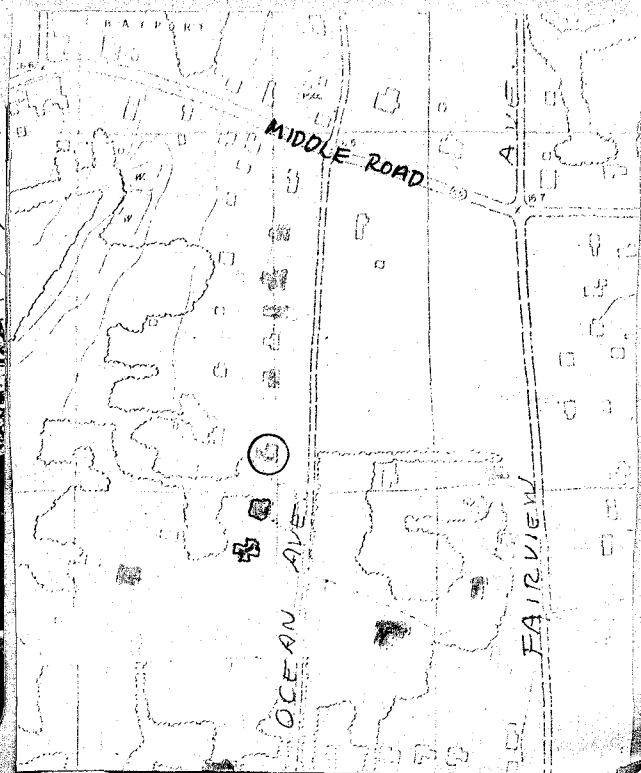

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Two and one-half story, five bay, Italianate house with facade gable over front entrance, with Gothic-headed window in gable over front door. Paired brackets. Large, two and one-half story Queen Anne addition in rear. Large Queen Anne chimney with panels on south side. Three story, round Loire tower with high conical roof and shingle style gallery at third floor level on south.

This house and extensive acreage belonged to Jno. M. Morgan in 1902, and in 1915.
