20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

One and one-half story Queen Anne, gambrel roof structure with jerkin-headed gable on front facade, north end. Decorative shingles in gable. Horizontal base of flush vertical boarding.

This house may have been moved from the Purdy estate which stretched from Middle Road south between what are now Bayview and Connecticut Avenues. Purdy owned this property, having acquired it between 1902 and 1915. A bath house further south is marked on the 1915 map. (see BA 76A.)
