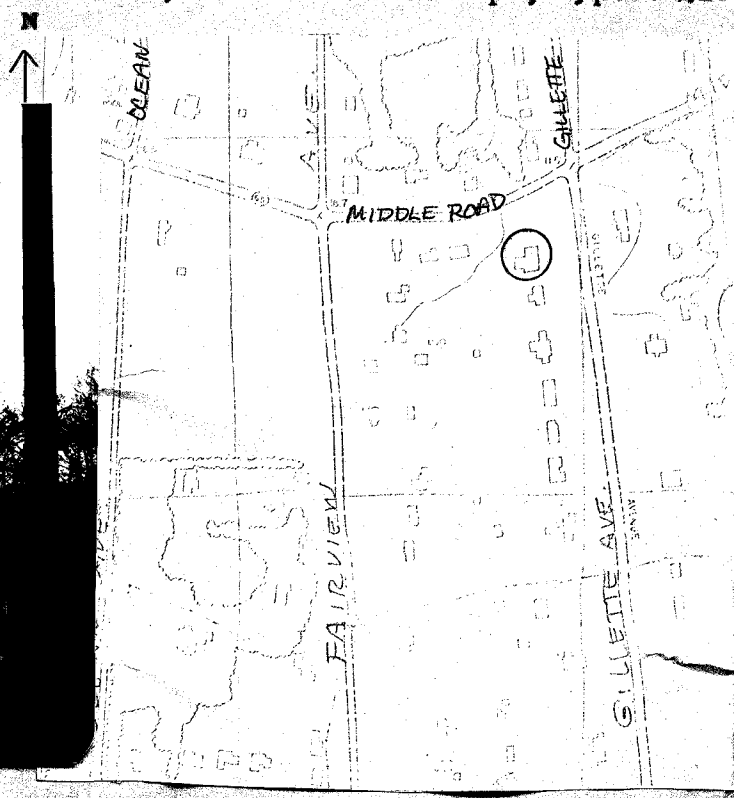
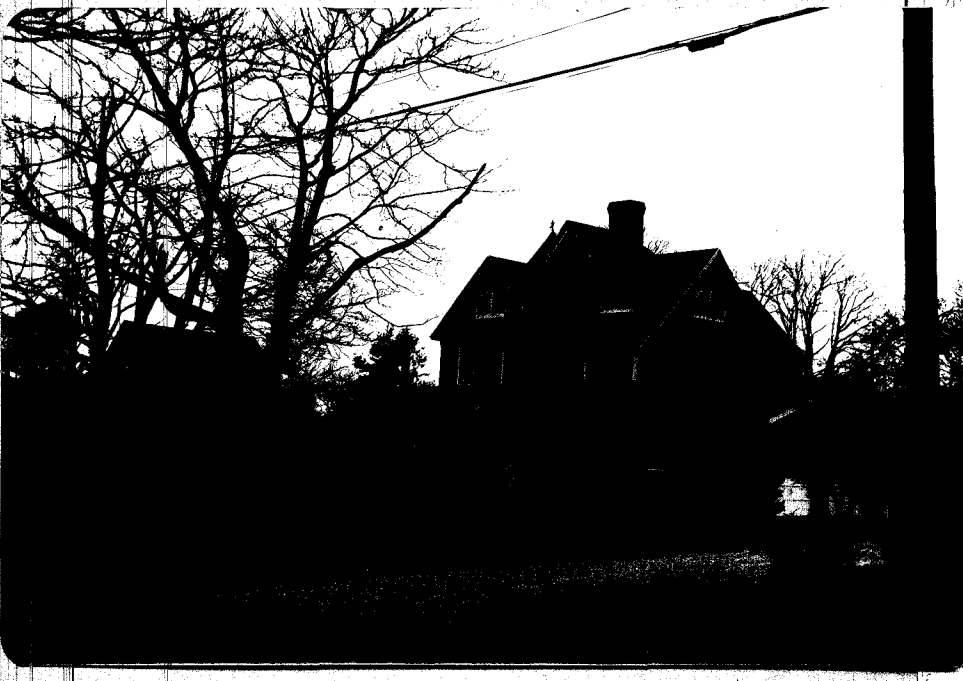

**Large, two and one-half story, Queen Anne mansion. Irregular gabled roof with scalloped shingles in peaks and Queen Anne windows in gables. One large triangular window with sunburst motive above. Engaged, round tower with pointed roof on north side at interior corner. The original long front porch has been completely enclosed in glass, obscuring the first floor front. This house was built by Mrs. E.S. Gillette and owned by her in 1915 AND 1902.**
