17. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDING AND SURROUNDINGS: (Indicate if building or structure is in an historic district)

The American Legion Post is located on the south side of Hubar Street in a residential area of detached houses that date from predominantly the early to mid 20th century with some earlier houses intermixed. The building is fronted by an unpaved parking field.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

The American Legion Post is a $1\frac{1}{2}$ story, gable roof, brick, clapboard, and stone building with a large gable roof. Semi-hexagonal bay on the principle (north) facade beside a projecting, pedimented entrance porch framed by timber brackets. The gable peak clapboards are designed to simulate log construction. Wave-edged vergeboards decorate the rakes.

The erection of this building was a remarkable achievement as the greatest part of the construction work was done by the Legionnares themselves. The property had been donated by Mrs. Charles Thuma and Mrs. Aston Thuma in memory of their parents, Mr. and Mrs. Bedrich Bild.

Considering that this is a Bohemian community, it was most appropriate that the Legion chose a Bohemian Forest-style for this structure.
