1090 Locust Avenue is located in the residential area of Bohemia characterized by detached houses that date from the late 19 th and early to mid 20 th century. The building is on a prominent corner parcel and fills the corner of the lot.
4. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

1090 Locust Avenue is a large, $2 \frac{1}{2}$ story, gable roof building that faces Locust Avenue. The ground story is built of rusticated concrete block. The principle (east) facade retains the original store front configuration of an indented center entrance flanked by plate glass display windows.
