

The building is a 4 story and basement, hip roof main section facing the west with articulated brick cornice— with flat roofed wings on east(kitchen) on north and on south. Two wings projecting to the west are characterized by inserted square hip-roof units with matching articulated brick cornices and round windows (oculi) in frieze stories. The projecting 1-story brick entrance with parapet roof has round ineaded recessed doorway with decorative voussoirs and pilasters.	е
