17. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDING AND SURROUNDINGS: (Indicate if building or structure is in an historic district)

Central Islip State Hospital is located on a 1000 acre wooded property, running from Clayton St. to Southern State Parkway, on both sides of Carleton Ave. The grounds contain buildings from various periods and in various architectural styles, including Tudor and Colonial Revival. These buildings face Carleton Ave., as do other staff buildings. 18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known).

Staff Cottages D and E are formal brick cottages with slate roofs. Staff building #88 is a large two story brick building with a long gabled main section flanked by two projecting gabled wings.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Brick staff cottages D and E have one bay entrance porches with ogee arches and diagonal latticework. They have slate hip roofs. The segmental arched dormers penetrate the roof, but are flush with the facade. The houses are three bays by one bay, and have gable roofed wings with return cornices at the northeast. On the south side there is an additional clapboard wing with its roof serving as a terrace. There are brick grilles in front of the lavabory windows. Staff building #88 has entries at the corner intersection of its main section and wings. It has six-over-six windows and a slate roof.
