



20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:
These seven Colonial style houses are used as staff cottages
for the Central Islip State Hospital. They are in unspoiled condition
retaining most of their original detail. Going from bouth to south:
#1. Hip Roof Type, with frieze and fretwork, and one bay entrance
porch with coupled columns and sidelights.
#2. Gable Roof Type, with one bay gabled entrance porch, dentils,
and multi-paned sidelights.
#3. Gambrel Roof Type, with multi-paned sidelights, slate roor, and
eight-over-one windows.
#4. Hip Roof Type, with one bay pedimeted entrance porch with
coupled columns, and sidelights.
