



	The Staller Building is a large, two story, low gable roof, aluminum, metal panel, and glass building with prominent hexagonal facade panels on the gable ends delineated with diagonal ribbing. The broad facades of the building feature extruded aluminum frames symmetrically arranged over a ribbon window. The ground story is predominantly glass.

	Laboratories factory in Garden City. Rudolph planned a large complex that would have cost three times more than expected, so Staller asked Rudolph L. Melk, an architect from Valley Stream, to adopt the Rudolph
	design.
