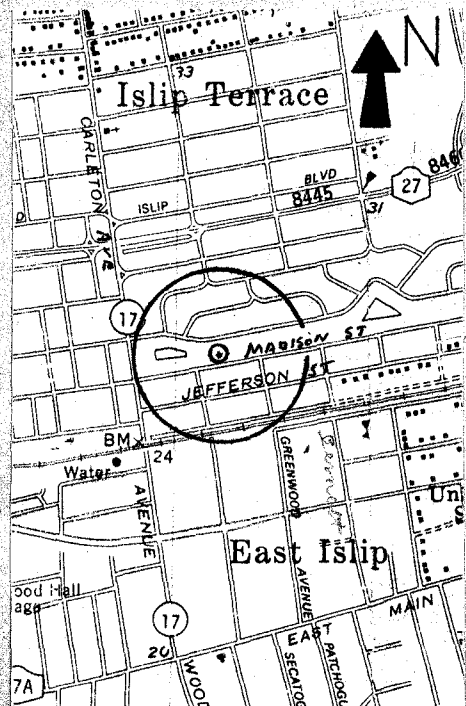

27 Madison Street is located on the north side of the street among residences that date from the late 19th century to the mid 20th century. The house is set close to the street line on a large parcel enclosed by a chain link fence.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

27 Madison Street is a 1½ story, three bay, side entrance plan, gable roof house set perpendicular to the street with a 1½ story wing on the west that contains a wall face dormer above a semi-hexagonal bay window. The main block is fronted by a shed roof porch with turned posts on a knee-high porch wall. 2/2 windows.
