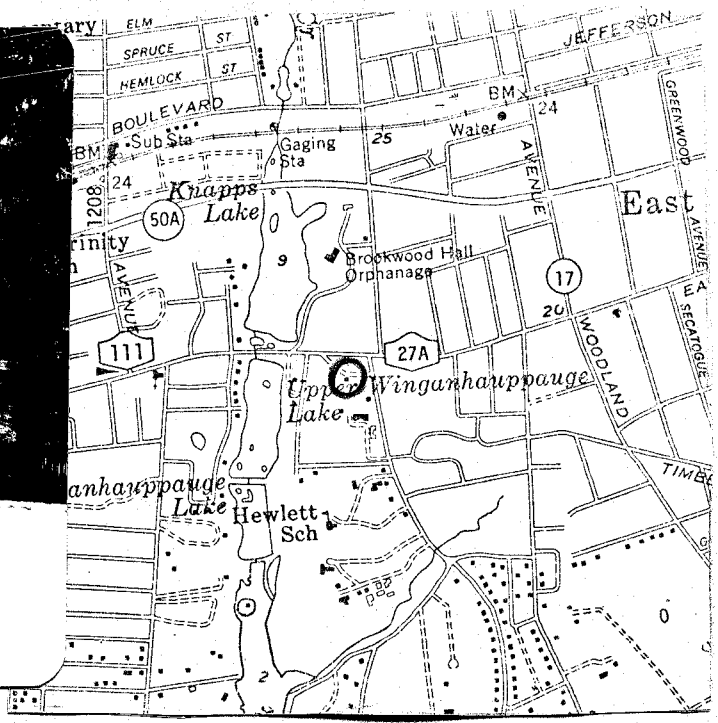

Stucco house has gambrel roof and Colonial Revival entrance with sidelights. There is one end chimney and the original porch has been enclosed on the North end. 2nd floor windows have arched tops on South side. The 5 pedimented dormers on the 2nd floor have casement windows the center dormer has segmental arched pediment with decoration.

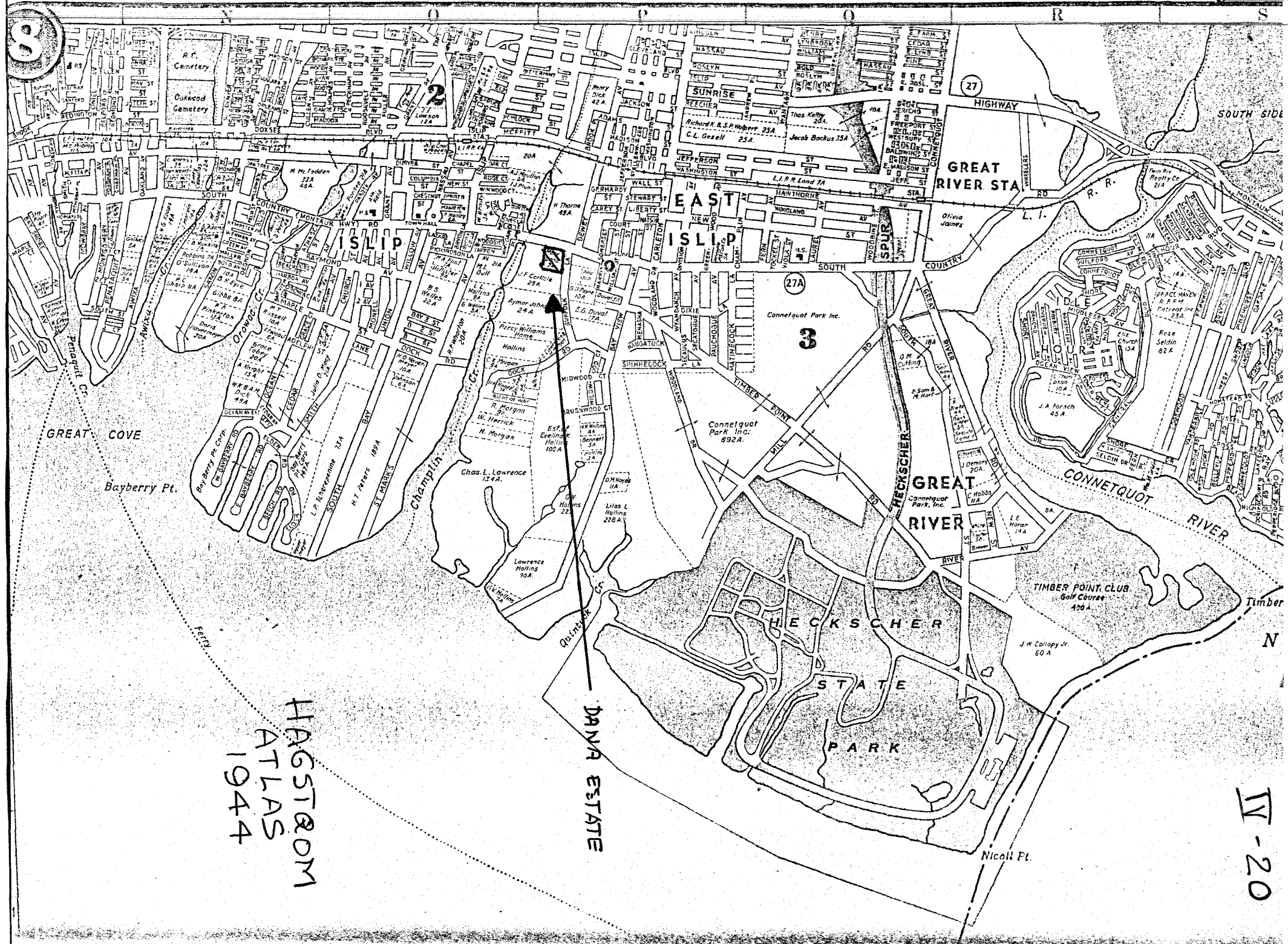
