



18.	38 Hemlock Avenue is located in a residential section built as an early 20th century development of identical houses. Of the many that line this and several surrounding streets, 38 Hemlock Avenue retains the most integring The houses are similiarly sited on small lots. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known): 38 Hemlock Avenue is a small, 1½ story, three bay, center entrance plan, gable roof house with roof breaks at the front and back. The house features a partially subsumed porch with squared posts that contain a base molding above the tapered section at the porch rail. Entrance to the porch is from the east side. A large gable roof dormer with paired windows is centered or the roof slope. Windows retain characteristic vertical panes in the upper NIFICANCE sash.
