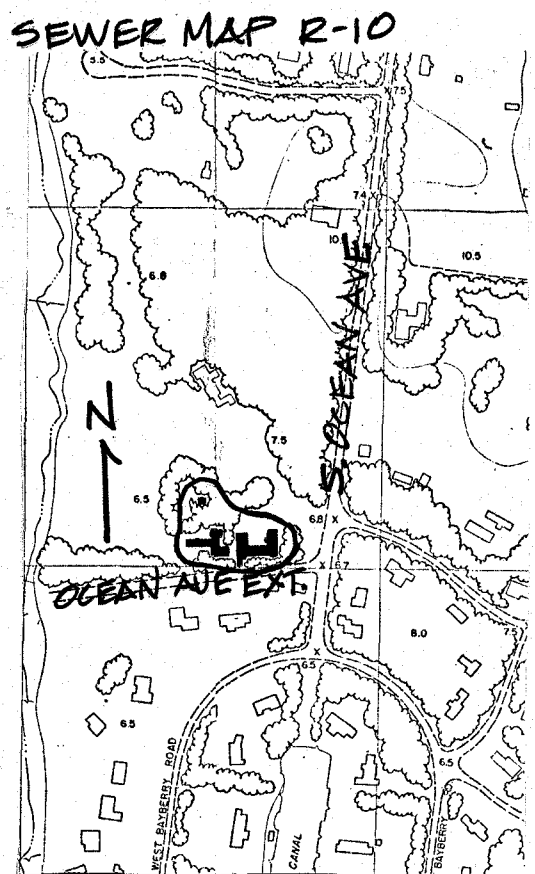

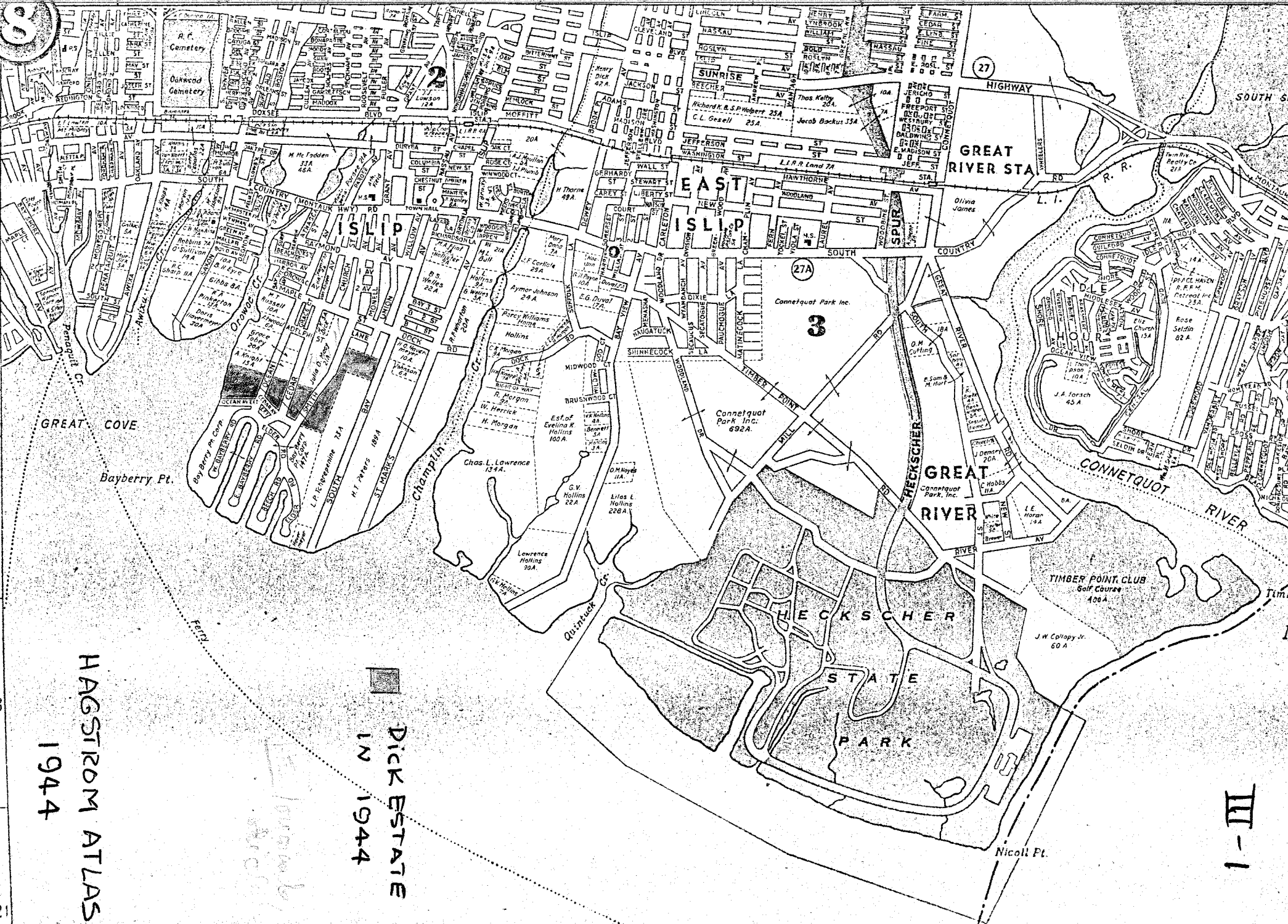

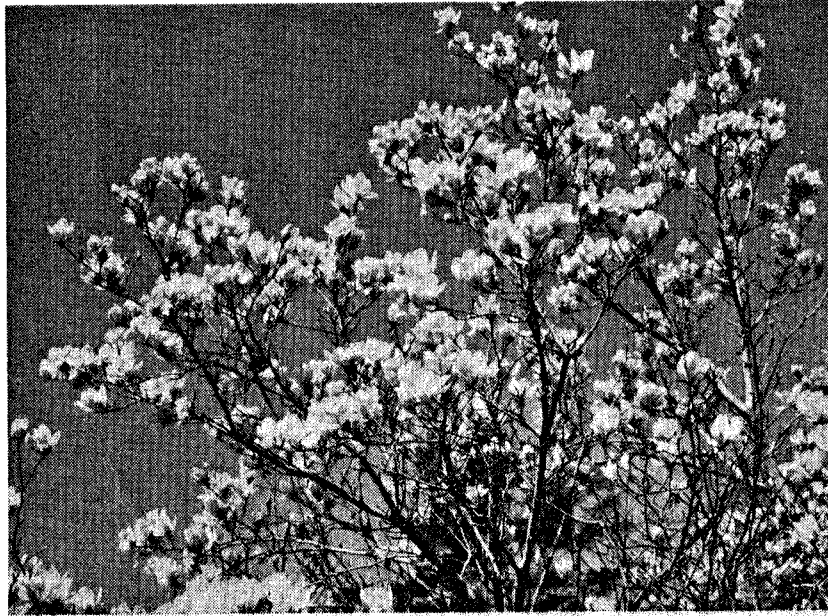

was contained in a public park, which was Prospect Park in Brooklyn. Yet in 1972, eight of these collections were publicly owned, two more were open to public visits and several more of the remaining ten outstanding private collections were being considered or planned for acquisition by public agencies. It is indeed gratifying to note that in the last score of years, the only noteworthy tree collections that have largely disappeared are those of H. J. A. Collins at Seaford and the Belmont Race Track.

Outstanding privately maintained collections still in existence today include those of: Greenwood Cemetery, Brooklyn; H. Brickman, Kings Point; A. Summers, North Hills; J. Cattier, Matinecock; Harrison House, formerly Mrs. J. Pratt, Glen Cove; Richardson Pratt, Glen Cove; Mrs. Junius Morgan, Glen Cove; Howard Phipps, Old Westbury; F. K. Sanders, Glen Cove; F. Moseley, Islip; H. I. Trachman, Upper Brookville; L. Wittlock, Bayport; formerly George Hart, Wading River.
