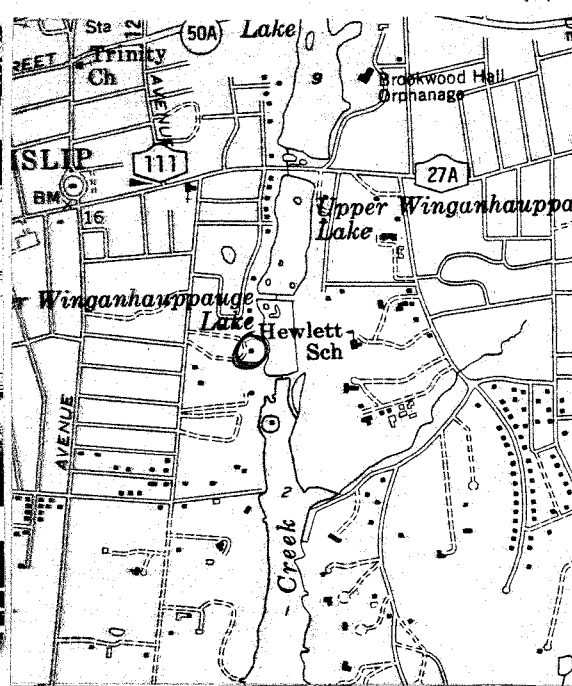

 Built by Dr. & Mrs. Pasternack in the 1920s, house is a 2½ story Normandy Style structure with slate roof, of whitewashed brick. There is a flanking 1 story wing. House has high peaked hip roof, metal casement windows, arched brickwork over opening and entrance, articulated brick cornice and small octagonal windows on either side of front entrance.
