


Back around 1900 this is how the interior of the present-day Community House on Gillette Avenue looked, with its owners, Captain and Mrs. Charles Z. Gillette sitting in the parlor, the front northwest room. Today it is a very plain unadorned meeting room, gone are its Victorian furnishings and the elaborate gardens that surrounded the house. But many children today enjoy the baseball diamonds and grounds, while scouts, Board of Elections and other groups make use of the meeting rooms. The Gillettes' daughter, Ida, was the last to live in the house. She left it to the Episcopal Church Charity Foundation, who in turn sold it to Islip Town.
