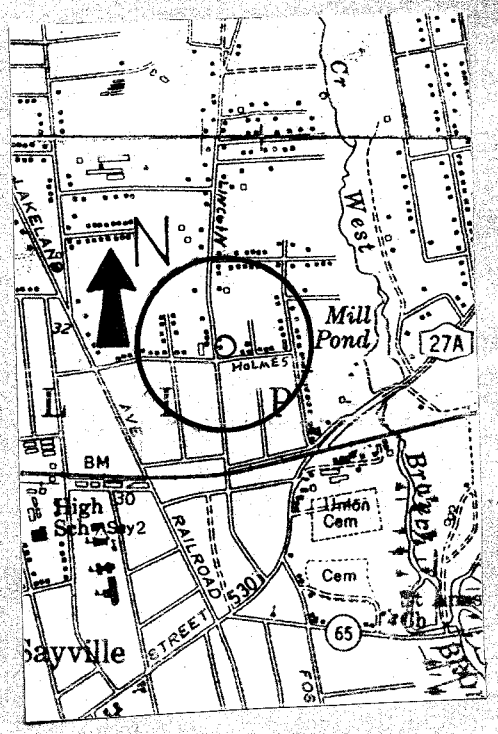

The Bahr House is located on the east side of the street in a residential area consisting of houses that date from a range of historic periods. Several stucco houses of this type stand in the immediate area (see also SY 9 and SY 13).

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

The Bahr House is a 2½ story, three bay, side entrance plan, gable roof house set perpendicular to the street with a smaller, 1½ story, two bay, gable roof wing on the south. The principle (west) facade contains a porch with turned posts and pierced spandrels. The gable peak features a round headed window with a pronounced lintel evident throughout

SIGNIFICANCE the house.
