

17. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDING AND SURROUNDINGS: (Indicate if building or structure is in an historic district)

The Cemetery is located in a predominantly residential area of houses that range in date from the mid 19th to the mid 20th century. It is east of the Island Hills Golf Club.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known): The Cemetery contains primarily granite and marble stones and statuary, arranged around an oval roadway bisected from the entrance at Lakeland Avenue by an additional roadway that leads to a prominent statue. This pavement is bordered by large trees (Neg. KK XXIII-20).

Six rusticated masonry posts mark the Lakeland Avenue entrance. SIGNIFICANCE

The parish, St. Lawrence the Martyr, was established in 1876 according to Dickerson. The cemetery property was not acquired until later.


