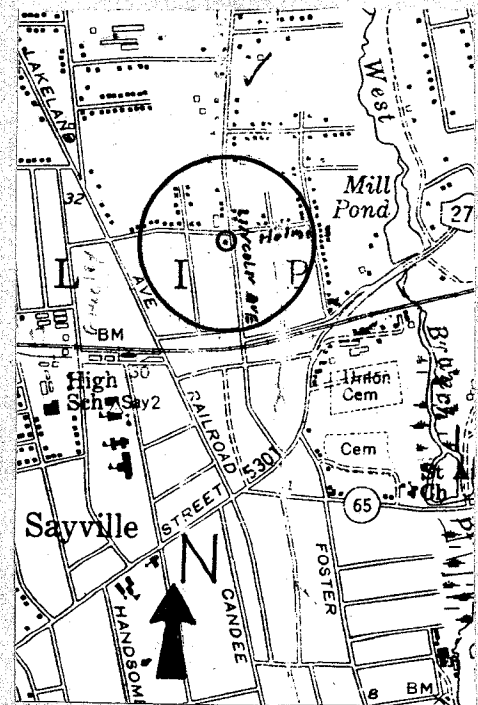

The Woodhull House is located on the west side of the street among residences of similiar and later date, including several similiar examples of this type. Little modern construction has occurred along this street.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

The Woodhull House is a 1½ story, three bay, center entrance plan, gable roof house with three small windows under the eaves. A screened porch covers the ground story of the principle (east) facade.

This is a fine example of a mid 19th century house type. Its integrity is excellent. This house does not appear on the 1858 map, but could have been built any time between 1856 and 1872. The house was owned by S. Angel according to the 1915 map and Carl Ulrich in 1902.
