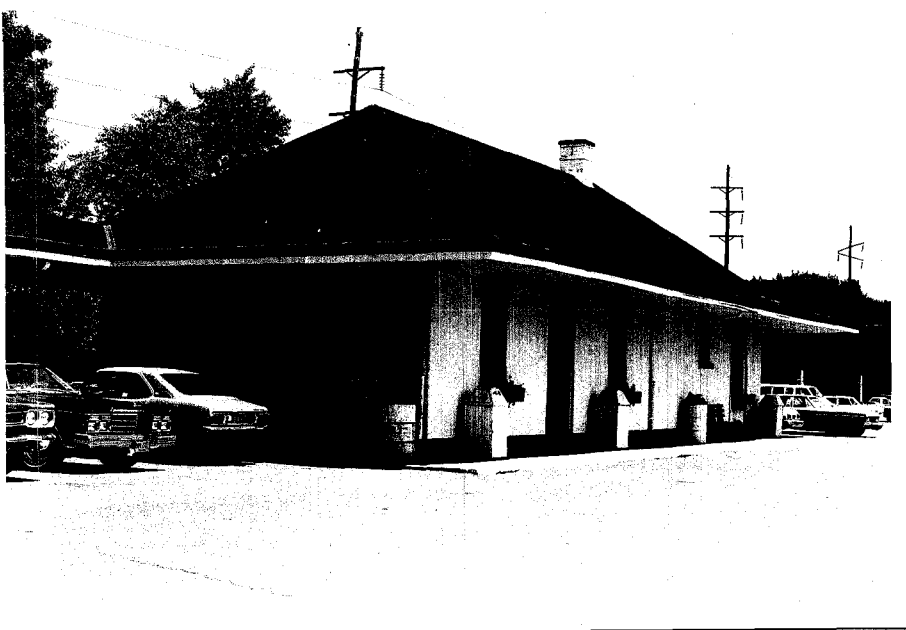

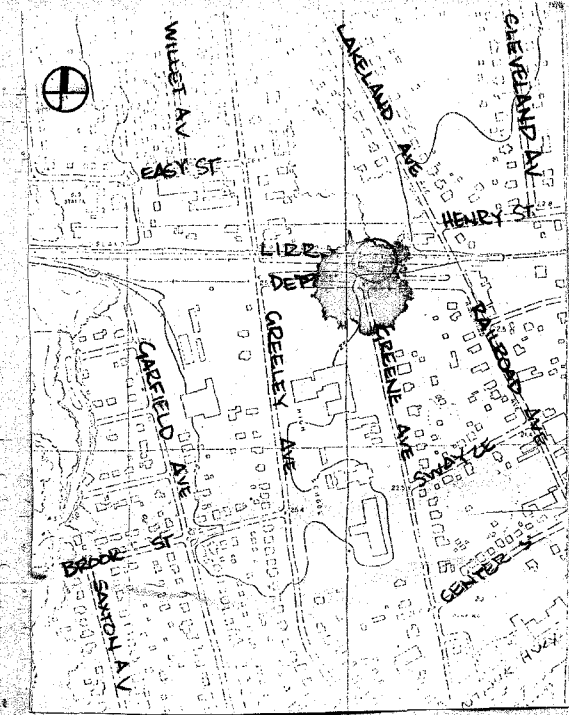

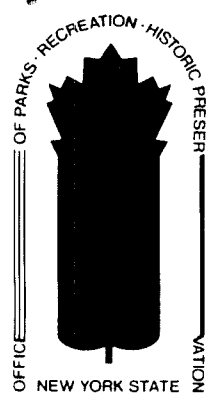
17. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDING AND SURROUNDINGS:

 The Sayville Railroad station is on Depot Street, at the north end of Greene Avenue, between Greeley and Railroad Avenues. The rialroad station is also located near the Sayville schools, and the site of the former school, "Old 88."

 1 story stucco building with hip roof and wide, flaring overhang, extending on east and west as platform shed, with soffit of original tongue and groove boarding. Windows have diamond-pane upper sash.
