

214 Tallulah Lane is located on the west side of the street opposite Gorgo Ln. among mid 20th century residences, south of the South Country Road. It is set farther back from the road than others on the street and faces east.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

214 Tallulah Ln. is a rectangular, $1\frac{1}{2}$ story, gable roof, side entrance plan house with an off center chimney. A row of small casement windows under the eaves of the principle facade distinguishes the house. A small, $1\frac{1}{2}$ story, gable roof wing is attached to the north.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

This old pre-Civil War farm house reportedly was owned by Ettinger in 1873. It is an important survivor in this area where there are few houses as old as this.

On this property there are two large Pepperidge trees (Tupels), an elm, and a heronry - where night flying Black Crowned herons roost in the very large yews.
