PROPOSITION 1: BUDGET

RESOLVED, that the budget as proposed by the Board of Trustees of the Connetquot Public Library for the year 2024-2025 in the amount of \$7,115,000 be approved and that the sum of \$6,836,000 be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of the Connetquot Central School District of Islip.

TRUSTEE ELECTION

Five-year term running from July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2029.
