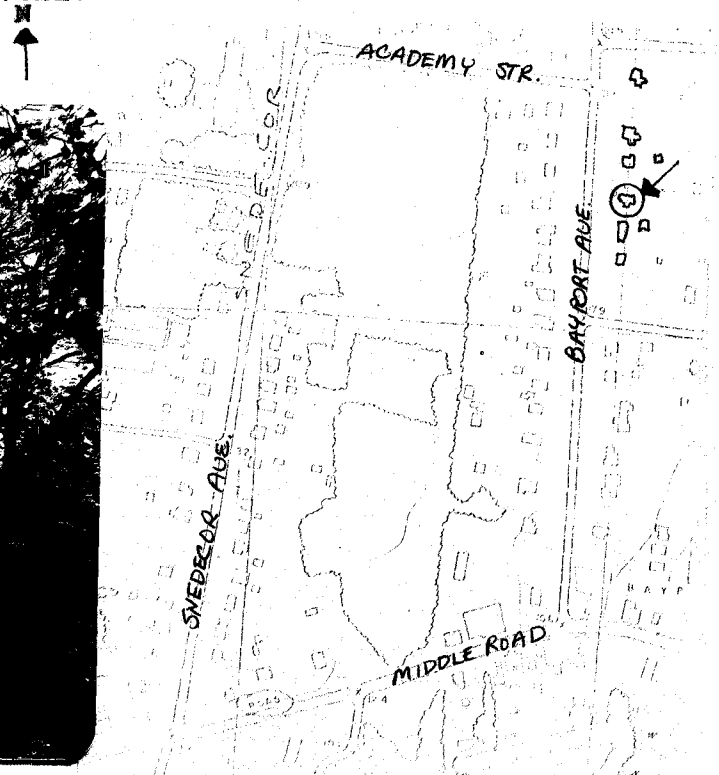

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Two and one-half story, irregular multi-gabled, Italianate house. Cornice supported with paired, turned brackets with decorated frieze. One story bay window on front (west) facade with double cornice and double row of paired brackets, both with decorated frieze. Similar to BA 5.

This house belonged to B.D. Overton in 1873, and to T.E. Hawkins in 1902 and 1915.
