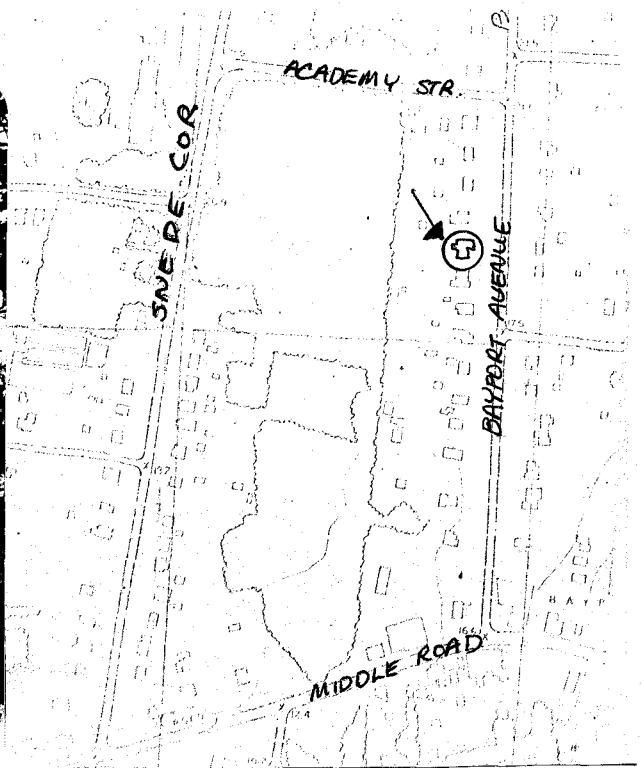
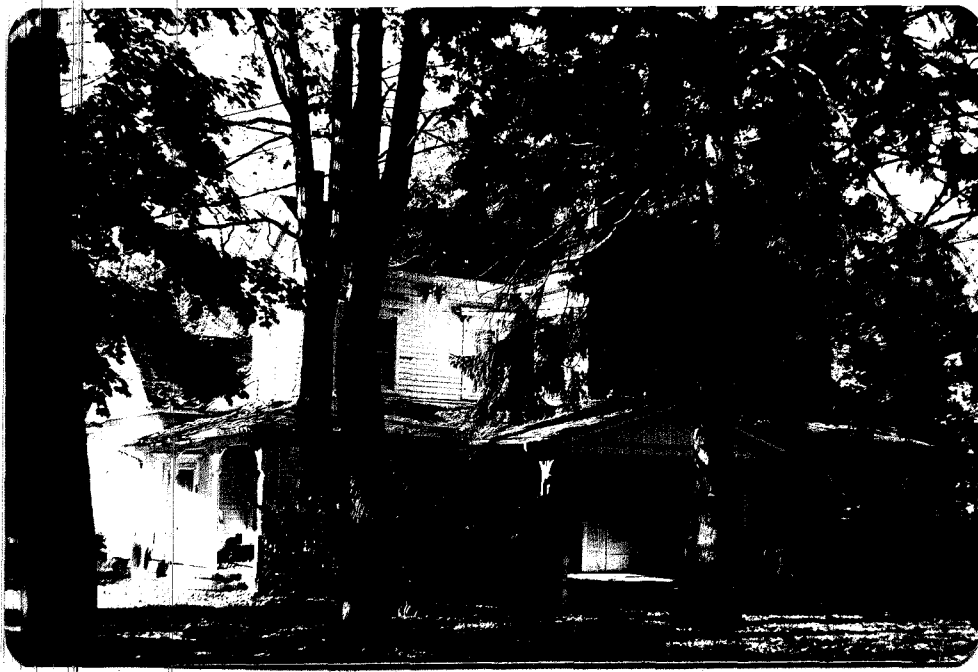

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Two and one-half story, three bay, Italianate, gable roof house with gable end to street. Two and one-half story, gable roof wing on south. Paired 6/6 windows with Italianate window-heads. Paired, turned brackets and panelled frieze. Wraparound Eastlake porch with turned posts and newel posts and sawn spandrels is later than the house. Round-topped paired windows in front door.

This house belonged to N.A. Stimmerman in 1902 and 1915. Possibly it belonged to Lynch in 1873.
