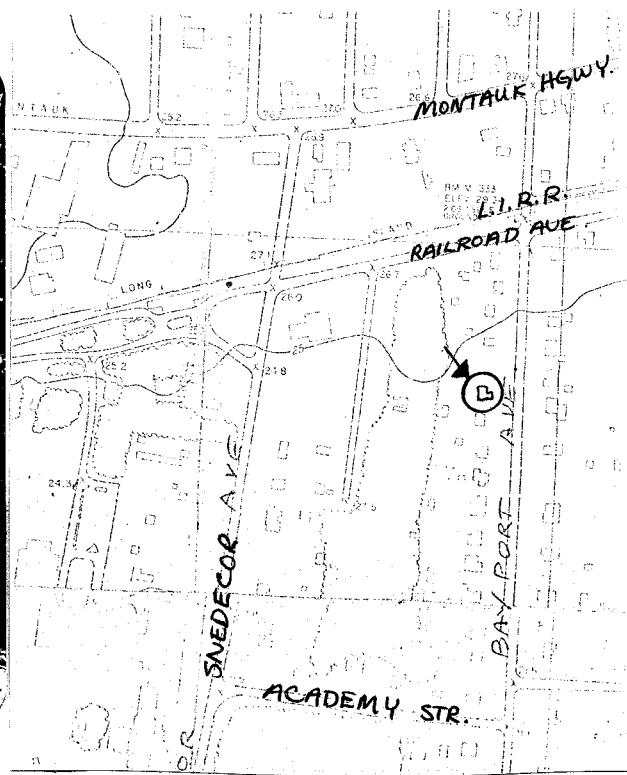
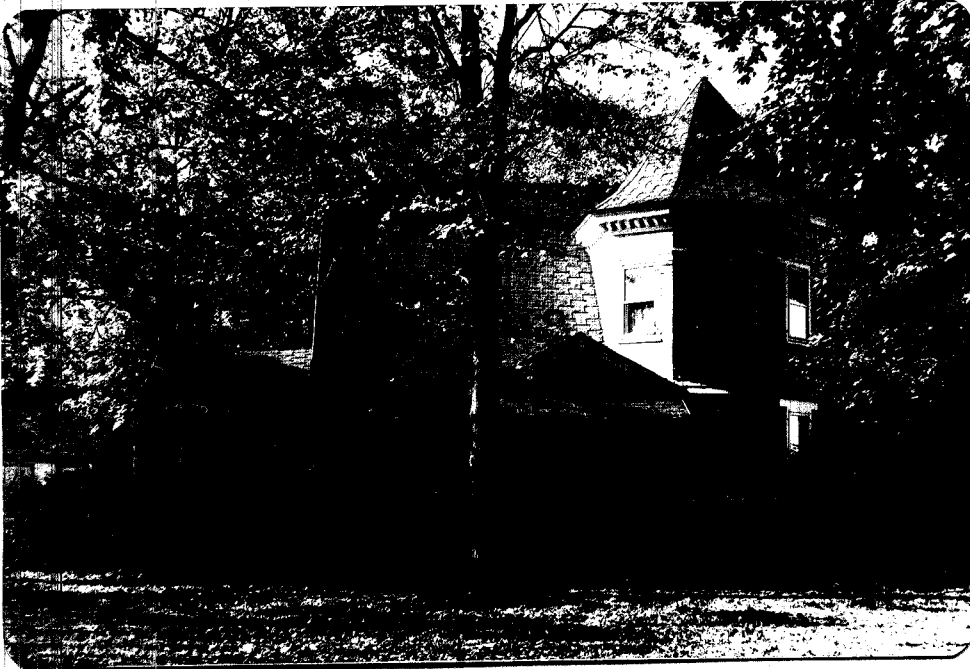

One and one-half story, three bay cottage with high peaked roof with large, two story, octagonal tower with high roof on north side. Pediment with decorative shingles over front door. Closely placed brackets under tower cornice. Queen Anne windows, multi-paned over two. Clapboard first story, shingled second story.

This house belonged to John Hawkins in 1902, and 1916.
