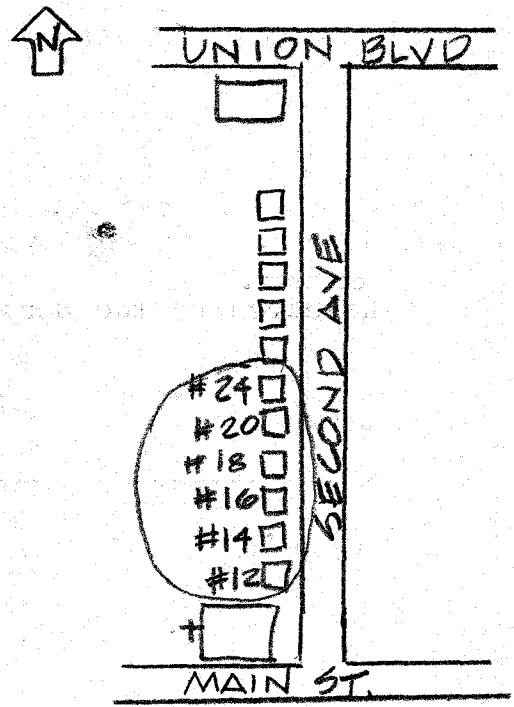

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:
#12 - #24 Second Avenue all date from the same period. They are Victorian-style houses and cottages typical of their period for Bay Shore. A 1915 Atlas of Bay Shore shows the houses and their owners at the time: #12 - Mrs. A Jacobs, #16 - E. Strong, #18 - A. Hallock, #20 - A. Barte, #24 - W.F. Downs. The row presents a typical streetscape in the 19th century.
