The building is located on the west side of Awixa Avenue behind a mid 20th century residence built on property formerly associated with BS 14, standing directly north. The barn/carriage house is partially obscured from the street by the newer construction.
5. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known): The building is a $2 \frac{1}{2}$ story, steep gable roof barn/carriage house with clapboards on the ground story and shingles covering the dormers, gable ends, and roof plate. The gable ends and principle dormer peak are marked by bowed hoods. The large ventilator is louvered with a pedimented roof. Diagonal door boards and $12 / 12$ sash windows remain on the building.
