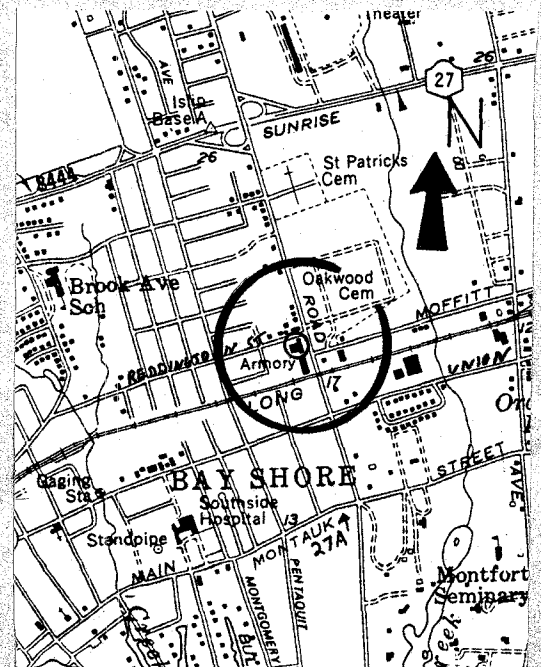

The NY State Armory Building is located on the west side of Brentwood Road north of the Long Island Rail Road and opposite Oakwood Cemetery (BS 59). The building is fronted by a small lawn with a flag pole near the entrance. A residential area lies to the west.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

The NY State Armory Building is a large, two story, flat roof, brick and stone-panel facility with a central gable roof wing set back from the principle facade. The entrance bay is slightly projecting with a masonry panel, two story surround, and veined marble spandrel under the second story window band.
