



 90 Garner Lane is located within the peninsula point on the east side of Lawrence Creek in the private residential community of the O Co'Nee Association. The house is set well back from the road to the west of the Garner Lane circle at Great South Bay, marked by brick posts.
18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):
 90 Garner Lane is a large, irregularly shaped, brick/half timber/stucco English Tudor Revival house with multiple gable roofs and a trio of conical roof wings on the east. The house is constructed primarily of random course fieldstone and features molded masonry SIGNIFICANCE surrounds and masonry quoins.





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
