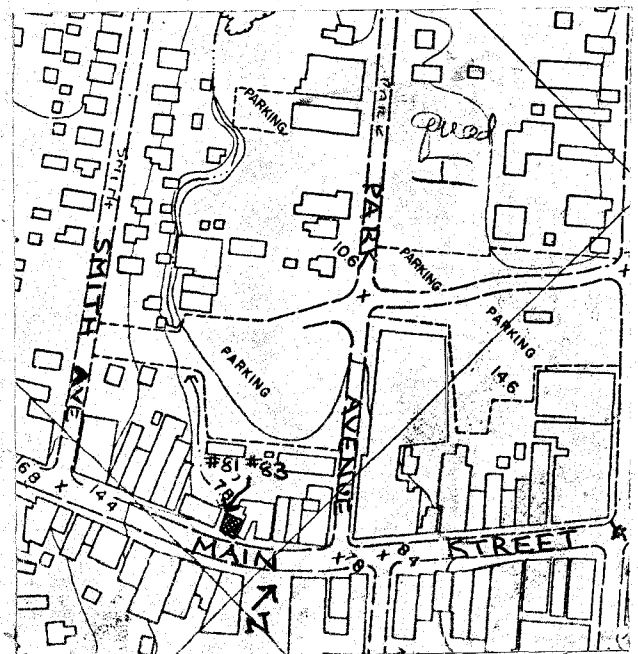
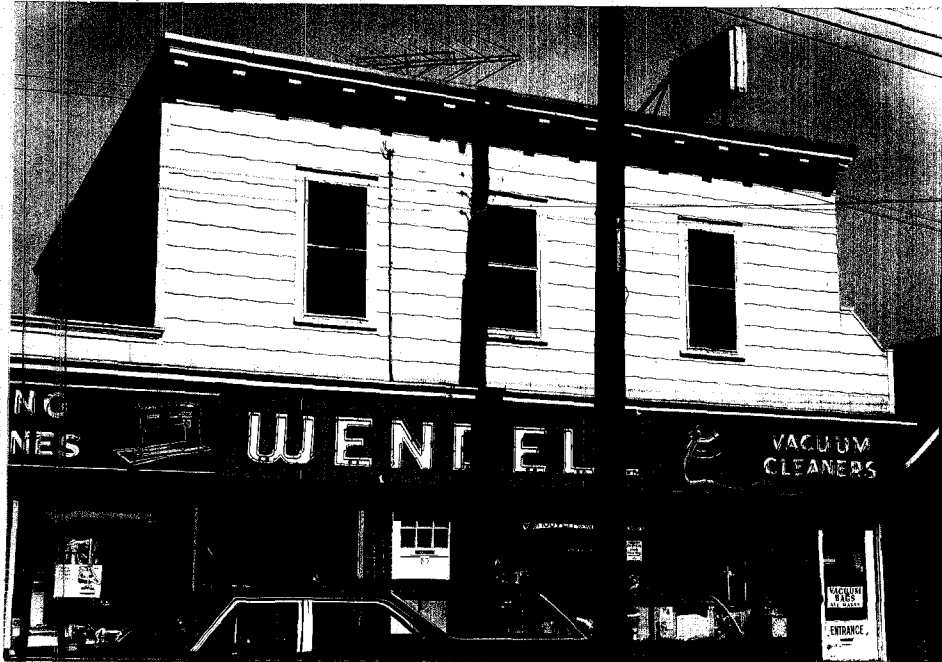

Despite remodelling, this building retains an Italianate air with its flat roof and decorative brackets. The west side has its original clapboard, and the east side some of its original clapboard. The rectangular windows have a simple molding.
