18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known): This Victorian structure has a clipped gable, vergeboard and decorative brackets. The design of the vergeboard is simple, perforated with circular holes. The building retains its original two over two windows. There is another gable on the west side of the structure.
