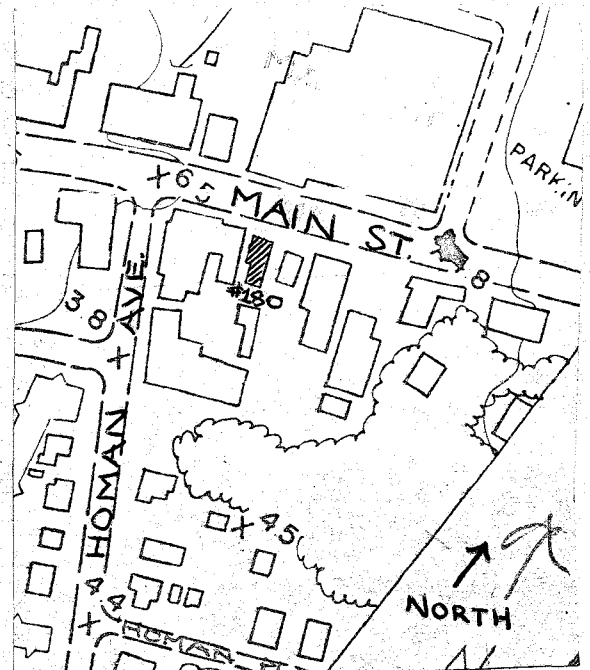
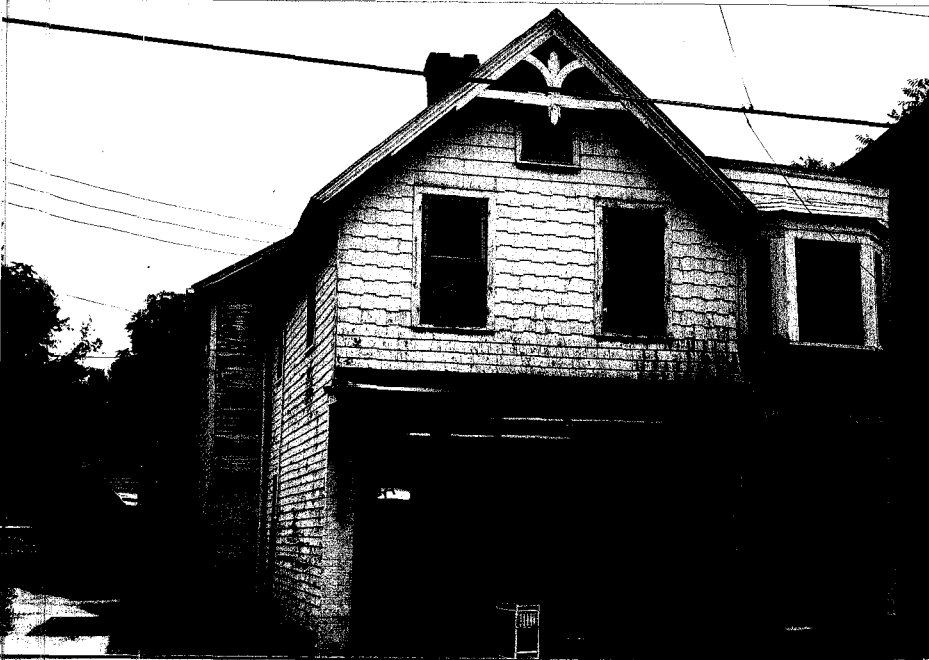

This building is on the main commercial street. There are other structures of architectural significance near-by, though from varying periods and in varying styles. Many of them have undergone extensive remodelling.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

This gable roofed structure has stickwork in its front gable. There is an oriel window supported by a corbel at the west side of the front facade. This window has some diamond-paned stained glass. In the gable, the rectangular shingles run straight across; below this, they alternate up and down.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

This building is one of the few remaining Victorian structures on Main Street. It has mixed use of surface materials - rectangular shingles in varying patterns on the front facade, and clapboard on the side. It also retains its oriel window with diamond panes, and its stickwork in the gable. There is a corbelled chimney in the rear center of the building. The site was part of the property of Joseph Robbins in 1915.
