

This house is in a residential area which runs south form Main Street to the Great South Bay. There are numerous houses of architectural significance in the area, ranging from ornate Victorian houses to simple baymen's cottages.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

This shingle house has a hipped roof and hipped roof dormers. The front porch has Ionic columns and extends to a polygonal glass pavilion with pointed roof on the south end. There is a portecochere on the north side. The front facade has a projecting central section.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

This two and one-half story house represents a style common in its era - shingle house with hipped roof and hipped roof dormers. The extensive porch, porte-cochere and glass pavilion differentiate this house from the usual. There are leaded glass sidelights at the front door, and flanking the front facade's center window and dormer window. The corbelled and panelled chimney is capped by copper.
