

17. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDING AND SURROUNDINGS: (Indicate if building or structure is in an historic district)

This house is in a residential area which runs south from Main Street to the Great South Bay. There are numerous houses of architectural significance in the area, ranging from large Victorian structures to baymen's cottages.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known): This two and one-half story, five bay Colonial Revival house has a gambrel roof. There is an original porch extending to a porte-cochere on the north side and to a polygonal pavilion on the south. There is a polygonal wing behind the porte-cochere; the wing's windows are diamond paned, as are those of the south pavilion. The first floor front facade has French windows. SIGNIFICANCE

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

This is a fine example of a Colonial Revival house. There are three pilastered and pedimented dormers with six-oversone windows; the central dormer is larger than those flanking it. On the north and south gables there are Palladian type windows with panelled center sections. The original cornice with dentils is retained. The window architraves have projecting heads. The front door has blind side and transom panels. The chimneys are corbelled. The original porch, porte-cochere, south polygonal pavilion, and north polygonal wing have all been retained.

The house has undergone extensive additions; the original section is much older than the Colonial Revival style would indicate.
