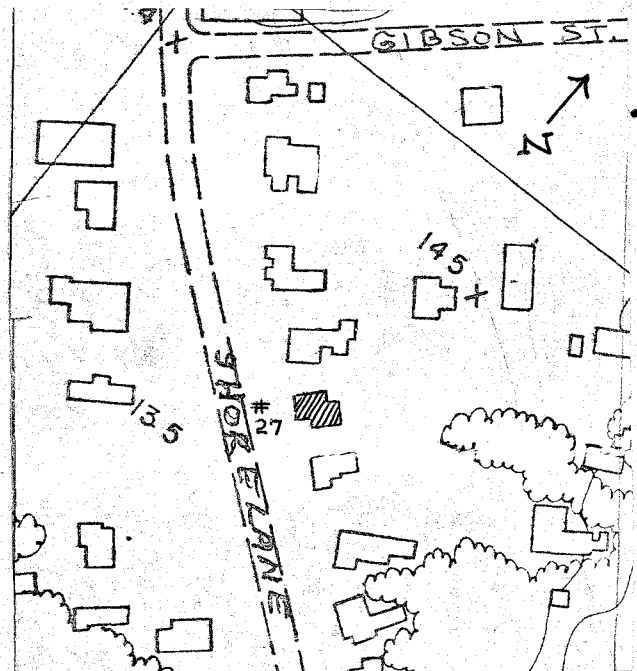

This house is in a residential area which runs from Main Street south to the Great South Bay. There are numerous houses of architectural significance in the area, particularly from the Victorian Era, in the Queen Anne and Italianate styles.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

This one and one-half story house has a mansard roof. The eaves have large decorative brackets. There is a one bay entrance porch - pedimented and with square posts. The original windows have simple architraves with slightly projecting heads. The dormer windows are gabled. The south side has a projecting wing with a bracketed square bay window.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

This house is one of the few Mansard-roofed structures in the area. It retains much of its original detail, i.e., brackets and projecting window heads. It has a one-bay pedimented entrance porch, and a small porch on the south side in front of the projecting wing.

The offset wing also has a mansard roof, brackets, and dormer. On the south side of the wing there is a projecting, bracketed bay window.

This house was the Ed. Robbins House on the 1915 maps.
