

20.	# 124 Third Avenue is an early house, built in 1830 by James
	Crowell. The addition of a Victorian porch and dormers have
	given the house a Victorian appearance. Descendants of the
	Crowell family occupied the two and one half story house until
	the 1940's. An 1873 Atlas of Brentwood shows the house to
	be the property of Mrs. Crowell. A 1915 Atlas of Brentwood
	indicates that the property then belonged to Mrs. J. Bennett,
	a Crowell descendant. The Crowells were amongw Breatwood's earl
	settlers.
