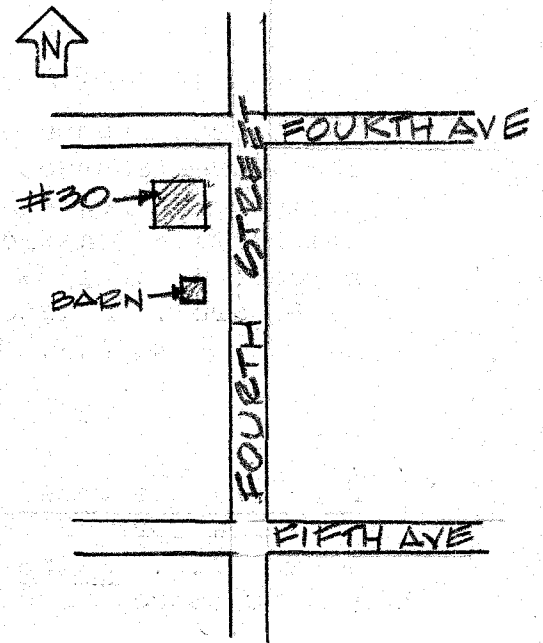

#30 Fourth Avenue is set back from the street on a wooded site. The barn is located near Fourth Street to the South of the house.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

Original windows. Original shingles. Variegated shingles in flared course above second floor level. Four flaring courses at First, Second, Third, and gable levels. Original porch with ballustrades. Cross gable front roof. Brick Foundation. One and one half story addition to rear of house with high frieze windows. Board and Batten barn with lean-to profile.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

#30 Fourth Avenue has an abundance of good Queen Anne detailing. The flared courses and variegated shingles are typical of this style. The lean-to barn to the rear of the house exhibits some interesting features that are decorative in nature. The house appears on an 1873 Atlas of Brentwood. It was then the property of Bigarel. A later Atlas of Brentwood, 1915, shows the houses to belong to J.P. Marin.
