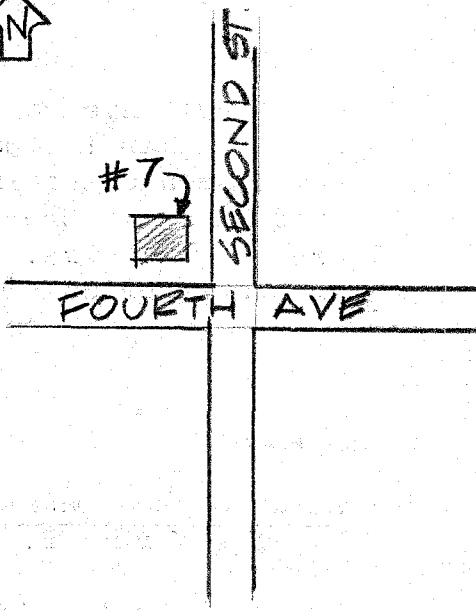
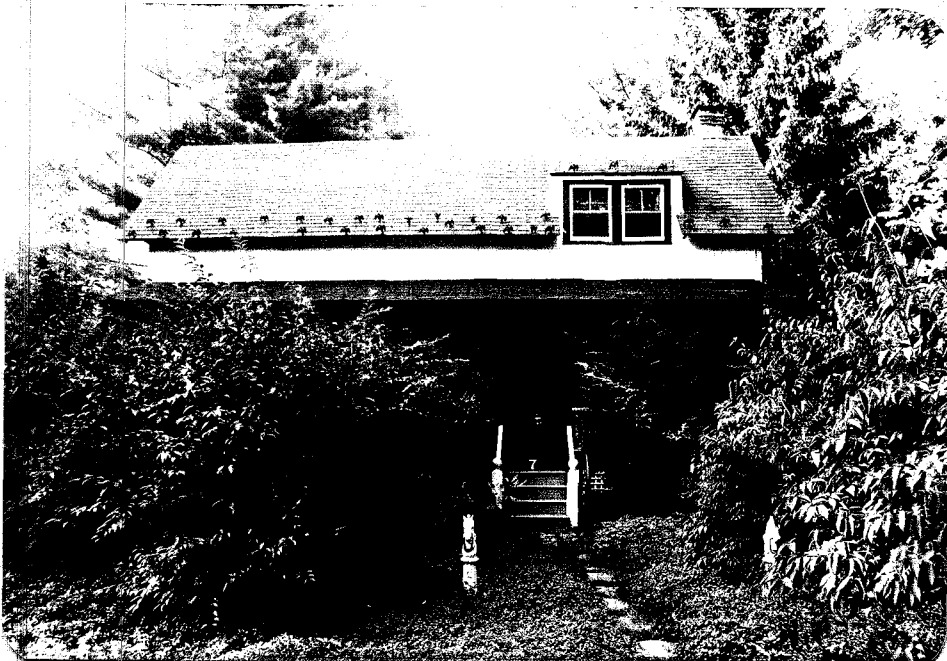

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

7 Fourth Avenue is a simple one and one half story house that was built in two parts. The earlier part of the house is to the west and the later part with dormer is to the east. A 1915 Atlas of Brentwood shows the house to be the property of Mrs. Hagen. Mrs. Hagen was said to have bought the house from an American Indian Photographer.
