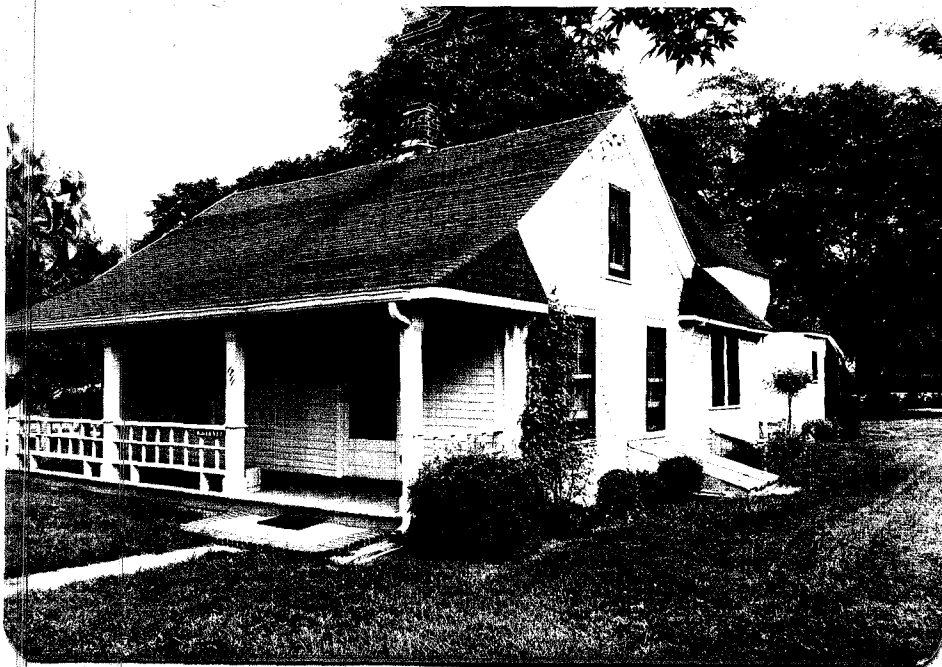

**Original clapboard. Flared Dutch roof facing street. Original windows. Original front porch with square framed balustrade. Tower-like one story addition to East side. Barn at rear with original clapboard siding, cupola, gambrel roof, original windows, frieze windows, original barn doors.**

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:  
**#1711 Brentwood Road was probably built circa 1820. On an 1873 Atlas of Brentwood it was shown to be owned by Thompson. On a later, 1915, Atlas it was the property of Mrs. H.M. Wittenborg. The house is an interesting conglomeration of basic forms. The sweeping Dutch flared roof that skirts off to the sides and forms the overhang of the porch is a striking detail of the house. The different shaped exterior additions to the East side of the house contributed to the house's curious nature. The handsome barn to the rear of the property is a scaled down version of a popular barn style.**

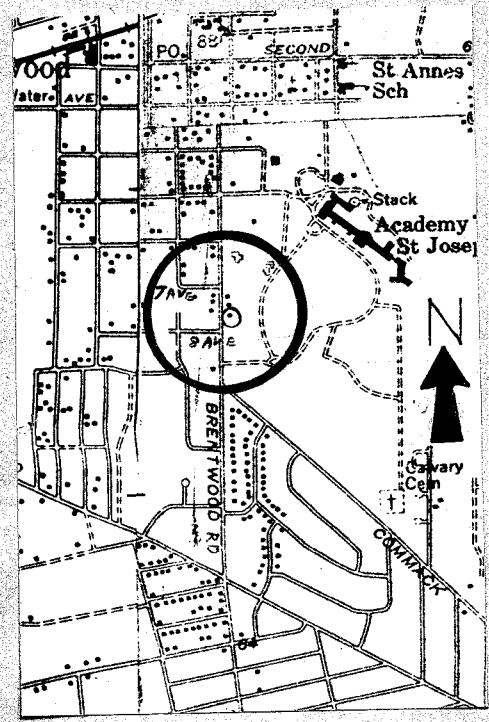

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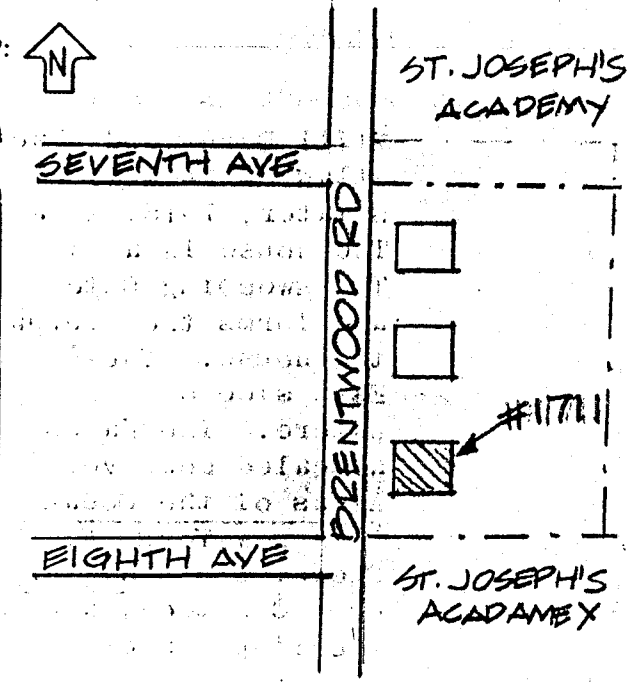
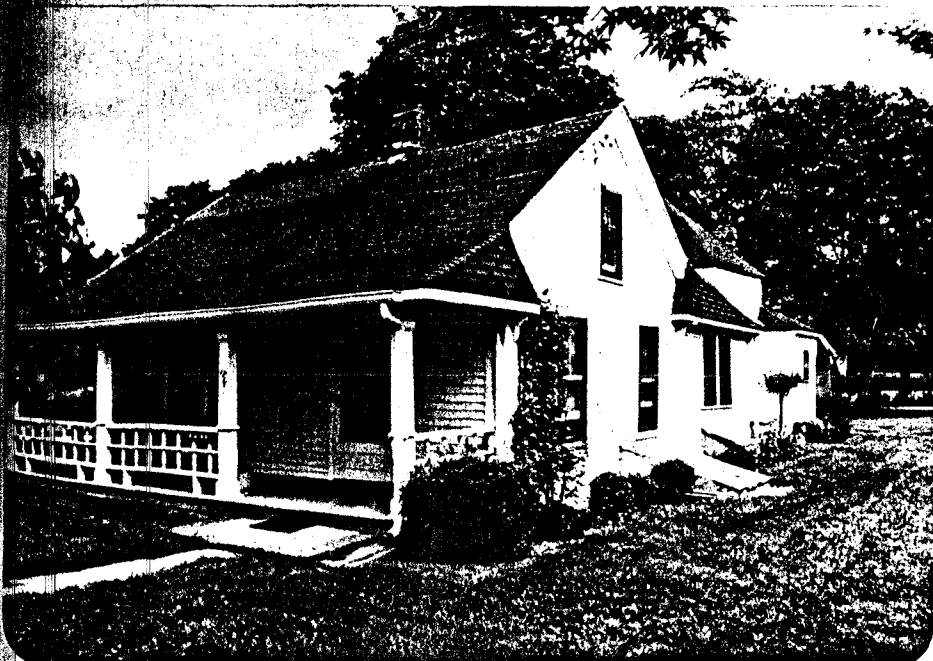
