

20.	HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:  1842 Thompson's Station Restaurant takes its name from the Rail-
	road station 🔩 🛬 which was west of Brentwood. The
	Restaurant at one time served as the Brentwood Hotel. It
	has undergone extensive exterior remodeling on its front (East),
	and side (North and South) facades, but has managed to maintain
	a sense of its architectural integrity. An 1873 Atlas of
	Brentwood shows the property to have been owned by J. Hilton,
	and the 1915 Atlas of Brentwood indicates that the building
	was then used as the Brentwood Hotel and was owned by Doering.
