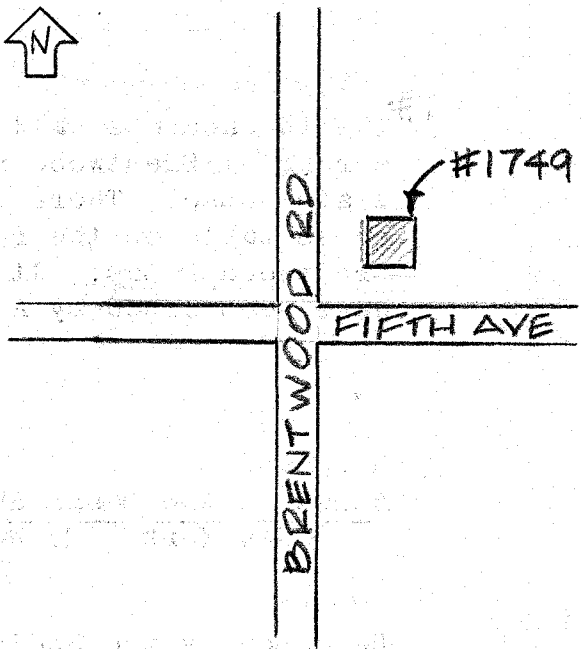
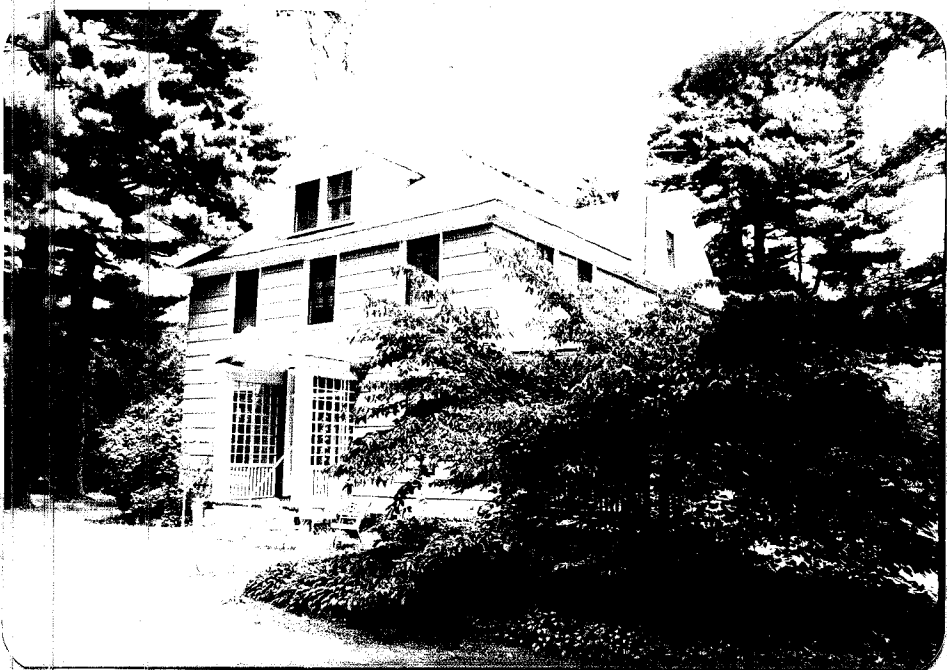

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:
The two-and-one-half story three-bay house at the Northeast corner of Brentwood Road and Fifth Avenue is a basically plain house. There is an interesting interplay of dormer and cross gable on the roofline. It is set among some beautiful Brentwood Pines. It appears on a 1915 Atlas of Brentwood to have been owned by A. Martin.
